



Cosmic Origins Presented by Fr. Spitzer

How did we get here? How did everything get here - our planet, our solar system ... our universe? For generations, science has ignored the concept of creation because doing otherwise would beg the question ... of a Creator. Today, however, we have compelling evidence - from science itself - for a beginning and fine-tuning of the universe. Throughout the journey, viewers learn that modern scientific paths point toward a very Christian understanding of how we came to be. *Cosmic Origins* expertly conveys a vital and important message for everyone - our Christian faith is not disproven by modern science, but rather corroborated by it.




A.D. - Trials & Triumph of the Early Church


Contemplation: Union with God


Divine Mercy No Escape


Fatima


Footprints of God: Jesus


Footprints of God: Apostolic Fathers


Footprints of God: Paul Contending for the Faith


St. Augustine; His Life and Spirituality


Restless Heart


Finding God in All Things; The Teaching of St. Ignatius of Loyola on Daily Prayer
